PASTOR'S COLUMN

ADULT CATECHISM

This fall we will be starting up our adult catechism series again. Fr. Curtis will be teaching the class, which will generally be meeting on second and fourth Thursdays of the month from August until Easter (the only exceptions will be November and December, on account of Thanksgiving and Christmas). The classes meet at 7 pm, in the parish hall, and run about an hour and a half.

I encourage all parishioners to reach out to family members, friends, and co-workers that might be interested in learning about the Catholic faith. An excellent opener is: "Have you ever thought about becoming Catholic?" Or, "I'm going to be attending catechism classes at my parish, would you have any interest in joining me?" Depending on the response you get, you might assure the person that showing up for the classes – and even registering – does not represent any firm commitment towards becoming Catholic; it is normal for people to attend the classes even if they are merely curious about or investigating the faith.

Our first class is **Thursday**, **August 8 at 7 pm**. Those interested in registering or in the full schedule can contact me by e-mail at frcurtis@fssp.com, or they can obtain forms from the parish bookstore. I will try to post the full schedule in next week's bulletin.

FEAST & OCTAVE OF CORPUS CHRISTI

This year we will begin what I hope to be a new custom at the parish: the Procession for Corpus Christi will take place at the evening Mass of the Feast itself, rather than on Sunday. Furthermore, this will inaugurate an octave of Eucharistic adoration, in memory of the former Octave afforded Corpus Christi. That adoration will take place every afternoon, from 1 pm until 6 pm, except on Sunday, when it will begin a bit later, after the High Mass.

This Octave of Corpus Christi was the reason that the Feast of the Sacred Heart was inserted into the calendar in its particular spot; that is, nine days after Corpus Christi. When Our Lord requested a Feast in honor of his Sacred Heart, he specifically wanted it on the day after the Octave of Corpus Christi, to emphasize the need to make acts of reparation for sins of sacrilege against the Most Holy Eucharist. Thus, Corpus Christi and the Sacred Heart were to be inextricably linked in the minds of the faithful. It is my hope that, with this new practice, we will return to emphasizing the bond between these two mysteries, so important to Our Lord.
