PASTOR'S COLUMN SUMMER CHANT

As you have no doubt noticed, during the summer months of June to August, a men's schola has taken the place of the usual choir on Sundays. I plan to retain this practice during the summers in future years. The reasons for it are:

- To give the choir at large an annual recess from their duties. This used to be the practice at our parish but has been set aside for some years now.
- To give more focused training to a group of men that can act as the foundation and core of the choir moving forward.

An unintended but happy benefit of this arrangement has been encouraging the faithful at large to join in singing the ordinary chant of the Mass (i.e. the *Kyrie, Gloria, Credo, Sanctus, Agnus Dei,* etc.), since during these months a great number of choir members have been among the other faithful in the nave during the Sunday High Mass. I warmly encourage parishioners to learn the various ordinary chants and to join in singing them when they feel comfortable.

I hope to add some other means of developing the faithful's involvement in the chant over the course of the next year.

PARISH SAFETY & SECURITY

Last weekend, a man deliberately set three fires in St. Rose Catholic Church, down the street from us on Franklin Boulevard. One of the fires was to the altar cloth; the other two were positioned further back in the church. "We know it was intentional, deliberate," said Justin Sylvia with Sacramento Fire. "There was evidence left behind that then flipped this into a hate crime." On Tuesday, I met briefly with the security consultant of the Diocese, who informed me that this was the second fire set at one of our churches in the same week.

The fire at St. Rose burned for thirty minutes before it was noticed. Later, the fire department told the pastor that it was a miracle that the whole church did not burn down; they could not figure out how it had survived. The incident occurred late at night, after parishioners had left but before the church had been locked up.

For some time, I have been uneasy with our security situation in the late evenings. There is often a period some time after Mass, or after events, when only one or two persons are around, or even none at all, with the parish wide open. Therefore, effective immediately:

- We will begin locking up ten to fifteen minutes after the last Mass or event on parish grounds.
- Event or activity coordinators should always have a plan in place to alert the priests to lock up.
- Parishioners lingering or waiting for a ride should do so in the parish hall, where they can wait behind locked doors (*this also allows the rest of the campus to be locked up*).

Notice of Deadline for Filing Claims: October 1, 2024

YOU MAY HAVE A SEXUAL ABUSE CLAIM OR OTHER CLAIM AGAINST THE DIOCESE OF SACRAMENTO

On April 1, 2024, The Roman Catholic Bishop of Sacramento aka Diocese of Sacramento filed a chapter 11 bankruptcy petition for protection under title 11 of the United States Code.

If you were sexually abused by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim so as to be received by October 1, 2024, or otherwise you will be forever barred, estopped, and enjoined from asserting such claim against the Diocese.

Claims based on acts or omissions of the Diocese that occurred before April 1, 2024, must be filed on or before October 1, 2024, even if such claims are not now fixed, liquidated, or certain or did not mature or become fixed, liquidated, or certain before April 1, 2024.
