### PASTOR'S COLUMN

#### **PARISH GROUNDS & SAFETY**

I am imploring those that make use of parish grounds – whether for events, activities, or meals (such as the Sunday picnic) – to tidy up after themselves. <u>Every</u> such occasion sees trash left behind at the picnic tables or in the field, trash cans moved out of place and not returned, children's shoes or other items left behind, electrical cords left lying around, or electrical outlet covers not returned to their safe position (here I refer especially to those outlets by the gas meter outside the offices).

Also, during such occasions, I have sometimes observed cooking instruments (such as crock pots or griddles) left unattended and within reach of small children.

Parents and other adults attending these occasions should make a habit of doing a brief sweep of the area before leaving the parish, taking care of any loose trash or unsafe conditions. The last adults to leave should make a more thorough sweep to ensure the parish is left in the same condition that they found it.

# INTERVIEW WITH THE FORMER FRENCH DISTRICT SUPERIOR

At the General Chapter, it was alarming to discover just how much our confreres have been suffering in the French District. We have lost three parishes in the last three years; also, however, many of our parishes are unable to celebrate Baptisms, Confirmations, or Marriages. Others are further circumscribed in their ability to minister by severe restrictions on personnel; some Dioceses limit us to one priest in an apostolate, in spite of the fact that the finances and apostolic activity of the parish warrant the assignment of additional priests.

A few years ago, the (now former) District Superior gave an interview answering some of the objections against our society in France. His answers are well considered and nuanced, and I thought you might like to read it. It can be found here:

# YOU MAY HAVE A SEXUAL ABUSE CLAIM OR OTHER CLAIM AGAINST THE DIOCESE OF SACRAMENTO

On April 1, 2024, The Roman Catholic Bishop of Sacramento aka Diocese of Sacramento filed a chapter 11 bankruptcy petition for protection under title 11 of the United States Code.

If you were sexually abused by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim so as to be received by October 1, 2024, or otherwise you will be forever barred, estopped, and enjoined from asserting such claim against the Diocese.

Claims based on acts or omissions of the Diocese that occurred before April 1, 2024, must be filed on or before October 1, 2024, even if such claims are not now fixed, liquidated, or certain or did not mature or become fixed, liquidated, or certain before April 1, 2024.
