PASTOR'S COLUMN

PARISH VOLUNTEER SIGNAL GROUP

I have started a Signal (a "free, secure messaging app that uses end-to-end encryption to keep conversations private") group that I hope parishioners will join to facilitate coordinating volunteer opportunities at the parish. Some of you may already be quite familiar with Signal and its applications here at the parish: we use it to organize any number of parish groups and activities. The Altar Guild, for example, maintains the largest such group right now, and it has been invaluable for helping families find substitutes or for making occasional announcements pertinent to the Guild.

The parish volunteer group will be a little different than current groups, on account of my hope that it will eventually have a very large membership. To keep the group from becoming a nuisance, I have set posts to the group to "admins only" and given admin privileges only to the priests. This means that the group itself will not be a forum for discussion or back-and-forth.

I envision posting to the group with particular requests, along with a contact for anyone that might be interested in helping with a particular project. For example:

- We are looking for a few men to assist with the semiannual clearing of the gutters of parish buildings.
 Those interested can contact @Tom Johnson.
- Our parishioner Richard Williams died and his funeral will be on June 1, 2030. The family is hoping some parishioners might be able to assist with a reception after the burial. Please reach out to @Harry Miller, who is organizing the reception.
- The Christmas Party is fast approaching, and we are still looking for volunteers. Please contact @Yesenia Rangel if you can help.

The lead on a particular project or event may (or may not) create a temporary Signal group to address the immediate need and will let me know when he has a sufficient number of volunteers. At that point, I will communicate to the volunteer group as a whole that no more volunteers are required. On rare occasions, I may post other needs of the parish, such as the request I put out through the bulletin regarding the loan of an espresso machine a few weeks ago.
