NOVERITIS, "LET YE KNOW!"

At the Council of Nicaea (325 AD) the issue of calculating Easter was discussed. Although it is not in the published canons from that council, the issue seems to have been settled and uniformity desired amongst all the Churches. St Athanasius, writing to the bishops of Africa in 369 AD, says "The former council was summoned because of the Arian heresy and because of Easter, in that they of Syria, Cilicia and Mesopotamia differed from us and kept the feast at the same season as the Jews. But thanks to the Lord, harmony has resulted not only in the faith but also as to the Sacred Feast."

St. Cyril of Alexandria, bishop of Alexandria from 412 to 444 AD, inherited an already long tradition of writing an annual letter to be read on the Epiphany that would announce the date of Easter. According to Cyril, this duty was given to Alexandria "because of it's illustrious astronomers" and that it should "report annually to Rome the date of Easter, and Rome would communicate to the other churches." There is an even older tradition of Rome seeking calendar assistance from the astronomers Alexandria: Julius Ceasar updated the Roman calendar with the help of astronomers from Egypt. And so it seems the Roman church continued this logic for the calculation of the Easter festival.

By the end of the fifth century, it was already established that the solemn proclamation of the movable feasts were to be declared in the principle churches on the feast of the Epiphany throughout the Roman Catholic Church.

The proclamation on the Epiphany for the movable feasts for 2025:

KNOW, dearly beloved brethren, that by the mercy of God, as we have been rejoicing in the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so also do we announce unto you the joy of the Resurrection of the our same Savior.

Septuagesima Sunday will be on the sixteenth day of February. Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the fast of most holy Lent is the fifth day of March. On the twentieth day of April we shall celebrate with joy the holy Pasch of

our Lord Jesus Christ. The twenty-ninth day of May will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ. The Feast of Pentecost is on the eighth day of June. The Feast of Corpus Christi is on the nineteenth of the same. The thirtieth day of November is the First Sunday of Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom are honor and glory forever and ever. Amen.
