PASTOR'S COLUMN

PARISH MISSION

LITURGICAL PRACTICES IN LENT

Adapted and expanded from an announcement from Fr. Savoie

There are some more or less unique things that happen in the sacred liturgy during the penitential season of Lent:

- 1. Whenever the ferial Gospel is suppressed in favor of the propers of a higher class feast (for example, on the Feast of St. Thomas Aquinas or St. Joseph), then the Missal is transferred after the Post-Communion prayer and ferial Gospel is read in place of the introduction to the Gospel according to St. John. This maintains the integrity of the Lenten Gospels, which the Church puts before us over the course of the penitential season in a systematic way.
- 2. At penitential Masses, such as during Advent, Lent, and Ember Days and at Requiem Masses, the proper posture during the Collect and Post-Communion prayers is kneeling (except on Sundays). This is not always concretely relevant since, at Low Masses, the typical posture is kneeling for these prayers anyway, and Sung Masses typically happen on Sundays. At the ferial Divine Office, however, after the priest says *Oremus*, all would kneel for the prayer that follows.
- 3. On ferial days of Lent, after the Post-Communion prayer, there is always an additional prayer over the people, which begins *Humiliáte cápita vestra Deo*, that is, *Lower your heads to God*. Remain kneeling for this proper prayer. Note that this addition is *only* on ferial days, not feast days and not Sundays.
- 4. Whenever the *Gloria in excelsis* is omitted, the final command, *Ite, missa est,* is replaced with the *Benedicamus Domino*. This is because it is not a festive day, so the joyful command to go is excluded. In its place, the priest says, essentially, *Let us bless the Lord*. In fact, a more accurate translation might be: *Let us speak well to the Lord*. Hebrew, like many languages, uses various idiomatic expressions to communicate thanks and gratitude. *Let us bless or speak well (i.e. Benedicamus)* would constitute one example; it is used for thanksgiving, praise, and blessing (cf. Daniel 3). So when the priest says *Benedicamus Domino* at the conclusion of Mass, it is an invitation to remain and pray for an additional time.
- 5. A very visible sign of Lent is the absence of flowers from the altar. These are proscribed by the rubrics during this penitential season. They are not explicitly forbidden during the quasi-penitential Septuagesima, but most rubricians argue (reasonably) that it is always fitting to take down the flowers when Mass is offered in violet.

- 6. A similar striking sign is the absence of the organ, which continued to ring out during Septuagesima.
- 7. Something less noticeable only because we do not generally offer Solemn Masses on Sundays or ferial days, is the introduction of the folded chasuble for deacon and subdeacon, in place of their usual garments, the dalmatic and tunicle. These are not something proper only to Holy Week (when we will see them in use here) but to all of the penitential season. In fact, it is the folded chasubles that are the most sure sign of a penitential season (for example, they are not worn in Septuagesima, even though Mass is offered in violet).
- 8. Arriving at Passiontide (the last two weeks of Lent, which include Holy Week), the sacred images in the Church are veiled, as an expression of sorrow and "hiding with Christ" (cf. John 8, namely *Jesus autem abscondit se*). Psalm 42 is omitted, and the *Gloria Patri* is dropped from the *Asperges*, the Introit, and the *Lavabo*.
